### The Running of Exham House

The Lower School is where First and Second Form pupils will take their first exciting steps at Bloxham, before moving up to the Senior School and entering one of our eight Senior Houses.

For all Lower School students, their base on the school campus is in Exham House, giving them somewhere to relax at break time. We always have company in Exham House, whether it's the duty tutor or Mrs Dales or the Head of Lower School. Pupils will need to be at School by 8.10am for registration Monday - Friday. The School day ends at 6pm. For the Lower School boarders, their residential home is at Park Close. Park Close is their boarding house where they will go home to after supper and where they will be cared for by their Housemistress. Mrs. Heathcote, and her team.

#### **Internal Assessment Reports**

Assessment Reports are provided every half term by teachers to comment on academic progress within each subject. Pupils will receive two grades:

ATL: Attitude to learning

CWT: Currently working towards

Teachers will also give advice on how to improve. During the week immediately following the report, tutors will discuss the comments with pupils. On occasions, a pupil and their tutor might agree to write a Student Improvement Plan (SIP) to highlight key areas for improvement over the next half term. Pupils' parents/quardians will receive an email from the School after this point with log in details so they can access their child's report online. Pupils will be required to write their own self-reflection reports at the end of each term. These allow them to look critically at their own performance and judge for themself how they are progressing.

## Boarding Life at Park Close

Boarding is designed to be an enriching experience for students, helping them unlock their full potential. All Lower School boarding is accommodated at Park Close, located in a beautiful building a short walk from the main campus. The Park Close experience is built upon a strong partnership between home and School – if parents or guardians have any concerns at all, please get in contact as early as possible and we will do everything in our power to handle the matter, promoting the best interests of our students.

#### **Arrivals and departures**

At the start of term, it is helpful for all Weekly Boarders to arrive at Park Close on the morning term begins. If students are a Day Boarders, then they may either drop boarding bags in the morning between 8am and 8.15am prior to their boarding night or arrive in Exham House with their boarding bags. The same applies for the Day House students if boarding. Friday night boarders depart after Saturday sports commitments from the Dewey, usually at 10.30am. Day Boarders and Day House students depart from Exham at 6pm.

### Boarding Life at Park Close (Continued) -

#### **Boarding Provision**

- Day House Pupil Overnight Stays possible, subject to availability by emailing pchouse@bloxhamschool.com on Monday the week they want to board.
- Day Boarder Two nights boarding each week subject to availability by emailing pchouse@bloxhamschool.com prior to the start of each term. Subject to availability, pupils can stay until 8:15pm with evening meal included. Priority booking over day pupils. Evening meal, supervised prep and evening house activities, and breakfast following boarding included.
- Full Boarder Five nights boarding (Monday to Friday). All meals included. One laundry service per week. Priority booking on trips.

# A Boarder's Day

#### Waking up

Wake up time is 7am followed by roll call before walking over for breakfast at Main School for 7.45am on weekdays. On a Saturday students will be woken at 7.45am and will have breakfast at 8.30am prior to sport at 9.15am.

#### **Evening activities**

Park Close boarders will be supervised by the duty tutor up until 9pm. After supper, they will return to Park Close to get changed into home clothes and prepare for evening activities. They can expect a lot of fun planned activities but also plenty of time to rest and chill out.

#### **Bed time**

Pupils will be asked to get settled for bedtime from 8.30pm and lights out are at 9pm.

#### **Emergency Procedure**

If there is an emergency that requires evacuation of the building, e.g. fire, whilst at Park Close, pupils should congregate by the tennis courts, wearing footwear and a warm over-garment.

#### **Mobile Phones**

All boarders are given 30 minutes phone time during the evening. The House phone is always available for students and parents. Telephone number: 01295 724 337

#### **Access for Parents**

Parents are very welcome to visit Park Close by making arrangements with the Housemistress. However, in keeping with our Safeguarding Policy, parents may not visit the boarding house unsupervised.

### Uniform & Dress Code

- · Full details are in the Uniform Lists and Dress Code documents.
- Makeup is not permitted in Lower School.
- No nail varnish or acrylic nails.
- · All clothes and shoes pupils bring to School must be clearly marked with name tapes, including casual clothes, making them easier to return.
- · All uniform must conform to the lists on the website.
- All clothing must be machine washable and tumble drier safe.
- School shoes (worn with uniform) must be polishable and polished! Non-trainer style.
- Students are expected to represent themselves and the School in a fitting manner. In keeping with this idea, please consider the following further points regarding appearance:

- First to Fifth Form boys wear the School uniform of School blazer with charcoal grey trousers and a white shirt. Boys also wear a School, House or authorised School club tie. A black jumper is also available.
- Hair should be of a similar length throughout, not below the collar or showing the scalp, and trimmed around the ears. Students may not colour their hair.
- Jewellery is not allowed, including bracelets or bands, except for a crucifix/St Christopher necklace and a signet ring. A necklace must be removed for PE and hidden at other times. Facial piercings are not permitted.

- First to Fifth Form girls wear a blazer, white blouse, and either a School kilt with black tights or tailored black trousers. Kilts should fall to within two inches of the knee, A black v-neck jumper is also available.
- · Hair must be of natural colour. Long hair must be tied back in a ponytail. Extreme styles are not permitted.
- Girls' Jewellery must be discreet. The following are permitted: 1 plain gold/silver stud per ear to be worn in lobes, 1 small neck chain, which must be removed for PE and hidden at other times, watch, small plain ring, 1 small bracelet.

### **School Regulations**

#### ALL STUDENTS MUST:

- · Attend meals, lessons, Chapel and games and fulfil other official School commitments.
- Present a clean and tidy appearance in accordance with the Dress, Hair, Jewellery & Makeup Regulations.
- A breach of common sense may be interpreted as a breach of the School regulations.
- A breach of the "Golden Rule" (that we treat others as we would like them to treat us) may be interpreted as a breach of the School regulations.

#### **Bounds**

- Outside lesson times Lower School students must sign into Exham House every morning at 8.15am, and at lunchtime. Students must also sign out at 5.50pm.
- Times for visiting the shops on the High Street are as follows:
   First and Second Forms after lessons and activities with the Head of House's permission.



- Other than the shops area on the High Street the rest of the village is out of bounds.
   Other areas may only be used to go to and from School activities, or with the permission of a Housemaster/Housemistress.
- No students, except for Prefects, may cross the School lawns including the swimming pool lawn, use the door onto the High Street or the door outside the Headmaster's Study.
- Great Hall galleries, roof loft, lighting tower & cage, balcony & stage, and the Wesley Theatre
  are out of bounds except by specific arrangement with qualified staff.

#### **Food**

- No food or drink is to be taken out of the Dining Hall without permission.
- All students must know the times of meals and when they may start queuing.
- Those queuing for any meal must do so in a quiet and orderly manner.
- Students must have written authorisation (agreed by either of the Deputy Heads), from a member of staff if they wish to attend meals or start queuing at other than the stated times.
- School dress must be worn from 8.15am until 5.45pm. Students may wear casual clothes to supper under the following regulations: shoulders and torsos should be covered; skirts and shorts should fall to within 2 inches of the knee; no hats, pyjama-style clothes or inappropriate logos are allowed. Sliders, Crocs, slippers, flip flops and similar open-toed styles are not permitted in the Dining Room. (This list is not exhaustive but is a guide). The usual School rules about hair and jewellery remain in place during tea. The ruling by staff on duty about the suitability of dress at tea must be followed.
- Bloxham sports kit (covered by a School tracksuit) may only be worn in exceptional circumstances and if agreed to by either of the Deputy Heads beforehand.
- Eating in public places is contrary to good manners and the School regulations.
- The chewing of gum is forbidden at all times on site and on all School occasions on/off site.





If a student is unable to participate in games due to an injury or illness, they
will need to attend Palmer Health Centre to get an "off games" slip. This
should be presented to the member of staff in charge of the team and/or
group of which the student would normally be a part.



- · A summons to attend surgery takes priority over all other activities.
- If students are capable of participating in another activity e.g. cross country, gym or other rehabilitation work, this will be arranged. Otherwise students will be involved in the games afternoon with the relevant group or with the hosting of visiting teams via "meet and greet"
- At all times, those "off games" must remain on the School site unless permission has been granted from your Housemaster/Housemistress. Students off games may be asked to act in a support role.
- Any medication brought to school must be handed in and Palmer Health Centre will then decide on notes for storage and administering

#### **Transport**

- The School site is not a suitable area for bicycling. Any student wishing to use a bicycle for any reason should seek permission from their Housemaster/ Housemistress and must wear a helmet.
- · Students travelling to and from School should do so in full School uniform.



#### **Relationships**

• Public displays of affection are not appropriate behaviour within Lower School.

#### **Electronic Devices**

- Mobile phone will need to be handed into Exham House at 8.15am and can be collected at the end of the day.
- Mini earphones are useful to keep in a student's blazer pocket for Music preps.
- Devices may be watched at the Housemaster's/Housemistress's discretion.

#### **Miscellaneous**

- All property should be named. Lost property should be handed to Mrs Dales in Exham initially.
- No student may extend credit to any other student.
- It is illegal to be in possession of any offensive weapon. Any knife, other than domestic, with a fixed blade will be considered an offensive weapon.



#### **Day to Day**

- Parents should contact School as soon as they know their child is going to be absent.

- Parents will receive a weekly news bulletin from the Head of LS to include Lower School news and dates for your diary.

### Help & Advice

#### **Palmer Health Centre**

The school's health centre is staffed by registered nurses and a visiting school medical officer. They look after pupils' health and wellbeing whilst at school, including: general ill health, support for physical or psychological health conditions, emergency ill health or first aid, health education, support or administration of medication or general health advice.



If pupils feel unwell at home, they should stay at home and seek medical advice from their own doctor. If pupils become unwell whilst at School, they should attend the health centre for advice and support during surgery times. If the sister decides that they're unfit to remain at school, she will contact parents/guardians to discuss appropriate action. Parents/guardians must not arrange to collect pupils before they have visited the health centre for assessment.


